Every Essay must have a Thesis. A Thesis is:

- The prompt paraphrased with reasons (If you are given a prompt)
- Your opinion with reasons (for Persuasive essays)
- Lessons learned/Reasons written (for Narrative)
- The most important facts (for Expository and Analytical essays)









Paragraphs are 5 sentences

They are sort of like little essays with a topic, supporting, and closing sentences

Essays are normally 5+ paragraphs

They can be much longer, but have an introduction, (3) main points, and conclusion

300 words is normally 5 paragraphs

300 words is about a page worth or writing: 5 paragraphs of 5 sentences each









Introduction is a thesis and hook

Make sure to get your audience interested and tell them what you are going to say

3 main points are 3 middle paragraphs

treat each paragraph like a mini essay, covering that bit of information

Conclusion is a thesis and closing

Restate-paraphrasingnot copying-your thesis and bring it all together for the reader





There are lots of types of Essays:

- Persuasive/argumentative/opinion
- Expository/descriptive/informative
- Narrative (story)
- Analytical (report)

Ways to get started fast and save time:

- Start in your heart language for brainstorming
- Cluster and Fastwrite
- Use Graphic Organizers
- Revise and edit before you make your final copy
