



Our big goal for 2017 was to support and grow Living Stones Guadalajara. Not only do we have new partnerships, but ten children from that community gave their life to Jesus this year!

Our other two locations, Cajueiro and Lagoa, continued to give amazing care and discipleship to almost 100 children: we now have 8 full-time teachers (not including pastors and leaders) at those two locations!

A small rural town of about 30 families, 4 kilometers off the main road.

The children often do not know when their next meal is, so we serve a full meal each day, along with tutoring, computer, and sports classes. Started in 2010, 15 children came to Christ, and many are helping the 30 younger kids who are currently in the program.



The church was started through the Living Stones program: reaching out to the children, then inviting their families to a service.

Pastor Flavio started walking each day to this hard to reach community in 2010. His commitment and ministry has only grown since then, now married to Mercia (also an amazing teacher and leader), with their daughter Heloise.

His vision is to plant 20 churches in the next 20 years, through children's ministries.

Pastor Ricardo grew up in Lagoa, and knew the needs of the community first-hand. As the church began to catch the vision, they began reaching out to 30 children. They now have four teachers working to provide quality education and a safe place to 60 children every day.

Their goal is to have a complete grade school(k-5), and clubs (cooking, art, English, soccer, basketball, etc.) for teens, investing the time for long-term solutions.








Guadalajara is a poor suburb of Paudalho (pop. 30,000), located near the main road, close to the capital of the state, Recife.
