
Advent Ideas for Kids


Note from Rachel:


Many of you are probably familiar with the idea of Advent, and some of you with Lent. It is all part of a Christian liturgical calendar that I, coming from a nonliturgical tradition, was mostly unaware of. Advent is the four Sundays before Christmas (lighting a candle for each week, representing hope, peace, love, and joy- and then a white candle for Christmas day). Typical Advent calendars start December 1st to make it easier to reuse/commercialize, and others just do a simple four weeks from Christmas day. There is no right or wrong way to do it. **Advent is getting ready and leading us up to Christmas.**

After Christmas is called "Christmastide" which is the 12 days to Epiphany (in Brazil we called it Kings day), remembering the wise men. All I knew about the 12 days of Christmas was from the song, so when I thought it was the 12 days leading up to Christmas--not after. We are all learning!

When we were in Brazil, in a new culture and community, and away from our family during holidays, we needed to be intentional and figure out what we wanted to do- or it wouldn't happen. It was fun to try different things out, and find what really fit us and our growing family. I've put together the best things we liked: for us and for you. I've found that holidays are better spread out and shared, rather than squished into one day with too many expectations placed upon it. I appreciate Advent and Lent to have the time to sink my teeth into the true meaning of Christmas and Easter, and to share it and invite others into it with me.

















LENT RESOURCES



What we did! Double up the days for Lent (1 is also 25, 2 is also 26...




Cheap containers for each day with plastic eggs- you can put in candy or instruction note for activities









CHRISTMAS

25 Simple Daily Ideas for Advent

- 1. Begin your Christmas list of who/what you will give
- 2. Begin Christmas decorations
- 3. Review your goals from the current year-how are you doing?
- 4. Go over your own family genealogy
- 5. Go over Jesus' genealogy in Matthew and Luke
- 6. Put together a family Christmas letter to give out
- 7. Sit around with eggnog/hot chocolate and share stories of how God has provided this year
- 8. Read the "Three Trees" book (or another Christmas book)
- 9. Study Christmas traditions around the world
- 10. Study Jewish traditions and Holidays
- 11. Read 1/3 of the "Best Christmas Pageant Ever"
- 12. Read 1/3 of the "Best Christmas Pageant Ever"
- 13. Read 1/3 of the "Best Christmas Pageant Ever"
- 14. Evening with candles/fireplace. Have a candle lit every day until Christmas
- 15. Have an evening of worship

In Brazil, Christmas is less about presents and more about food. Many start the celebration Christmas Eve, and go to Midnight Mass

In Haiti, many people go to a Christmas Eve service that starts about 11pm. At midnight they sing the traditional song "Minuit Chrétien"



In Kenya, many churches hold night vigils, or 'Kesha', on Christmas Eve.
They often sing Christmas hymns and carols, and some have nativity plays

In Tanzania, families will fatten up a cow or goat to eat for Christmas, and many kids hope for new clothes, rather than toys, for Christmas



In India, Nativity scenes are called "Christmas cribs", and Kerala plum cake is served in place of fruitcake. Many Hindu's don't celebrate, but the holiday has become secularized enough that many do

Also like Easter, Orthodox Christmas is normally on a different day: January 7 instead of December 25 because they use a different calendar. The 12 days of Christmas (after Christmas) lead to January 6th: Epiphany or Kings day



Christmas is the most celebrated and universally recognized holiday worldwide. It is December 25th in most countries. Traditions vary from country to country

Christmas, like Easter, can be celebrated as a Christian holiday or a secular holiday, or a mixture of both. Many people celebrate Advent to prepare for the time of Christmas

A Basic History





Jesus was born in Bethlehem

You can read the accounts in Matthew 1-2 and Luke 1-2. The early church celebrated Christ's death and resurrection more than His birth, but many cultures celebrated a winter solstice, or a time of light during the coldest, darkest part of winter.





Pope Julius 1 choose December 25 to celebrate Jesus' birth

It was first called the Feast of the Nativity, and worked well since most cultures already had some kind of celebration in place. By the middle ages, Christmas had been embraced, but was more of a drunken revelry of the solstice than the Christian holiday we think of today. In fact, many Christians stopped celebrating it by the 1600-1700s.

Christmas officially becomes a US federal holiday

With Charles Dickens' "A Christmas Carol" and a new focus on caring for children in the 1800s, decorating trees, sending holiday cards, gift-giving (and Santa) quickly became new traditions for Christmas, brought to the USA by different European immigrants.






Christmas is a Big Deal

Christmas is the most celebrated and universally recognized holiday worldwide. The most money of any holiday is spent on Christmas (about 900 billion dollars). Most people connect it to being a Christian holiday, but celebrate it as a time of gift-giving and family time, often leaving the whole "Jesus part" out.




